Paul is finishing his fourth year at Dalhousie University, completing his Bachelor of Music degree in Violin Performance. He has twice won on the Dalhousie "Concerto Night" competition and has performed with the Dalhousie Symphony Orchestra. In 2008, he toured the Maritimes with Canadian music icon Anne Murray, performing with members of his own quartet as well as Symphony Nova Scotia. In his third year, Paul appeared with the Dalhousie Chamber Orchestra and again in 2009. A year later he appeared with Sarah Slean, Divine Brown, Paula Cole and MIR at the Dartmouth Multicultural Festival. Paul works as an extra with Symphony Nova Scotia outside their regular season, both as a violinist and as a violist and has done many studio recordings, solo recitals and concerts in Halifax. He has a growing interest in early music performance and new music initiatives and is looking abroad to begin his graduate studies, applying to schools in the United States, Germany, Holland and France.

- Be nominated by the institution;
- Previous recipients of this grant are not eligible.
